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Letter from Our Leadership

Hello everyone,

Serving as President and CEO of Boys & Girls Clubs this past year has been one of the greatest honors of my life. In 2024, we were fueled by a shared commitment to ensuring every child has the opportunity to feel safe, supported, and inspired to reach their full potential.



We began the year with an average daily attendance of 800 across our seven Club locations. By year's end, we had grown to ten Clubs, welcoming an average of 904 young people through our doors each day. These numbers tell a story far greater than growth; they reflect the trust families place in us and the transformative power of a space where kids know they belong.

The most telling measure of impact comes from our Super IMPACT members, those who attend the Club at least 104 times in a year. In 2024, that number rose from 1,198 to 1,230. These are the children who return again and again, seeking a safe haven after school, a place to learn, mentors who believe in them, and friends who feel like family. Many face tremendous challenges, yet they show up with determination, ready to seize every opportunity the Clubs provide.

Our mission is brought to life each time a child walks through our doors and it is your generosity that makes those moments possible. Because of your support, more young people than ever are finding hope, building confidence, and daring to dream bigger.

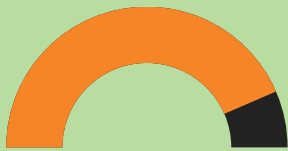

Ralph E. Capps 2024 Hall of Fame Inductee

For more than fifty years, Ralph E. Capps led our Boys & Girls Clubs with vision and dedication. When he became Executive Director in 1973, the Raleigh Boys Club had one building and 200 members; today, 10 Clubs serve over 3,000 youth, providing safe spaces, academic support, and life-skills training.

Known as the “godfather” of Boys & Girls Clubs in North Carolina, Ralph mentored leaders across the state and earned numerous awards for his service. His commitment extended beyond the Clubs to organizations like United Way and local civic groups. Through his tireless work, Ralph embodied the mission of empowering young people, and his impact will be felt for generations.

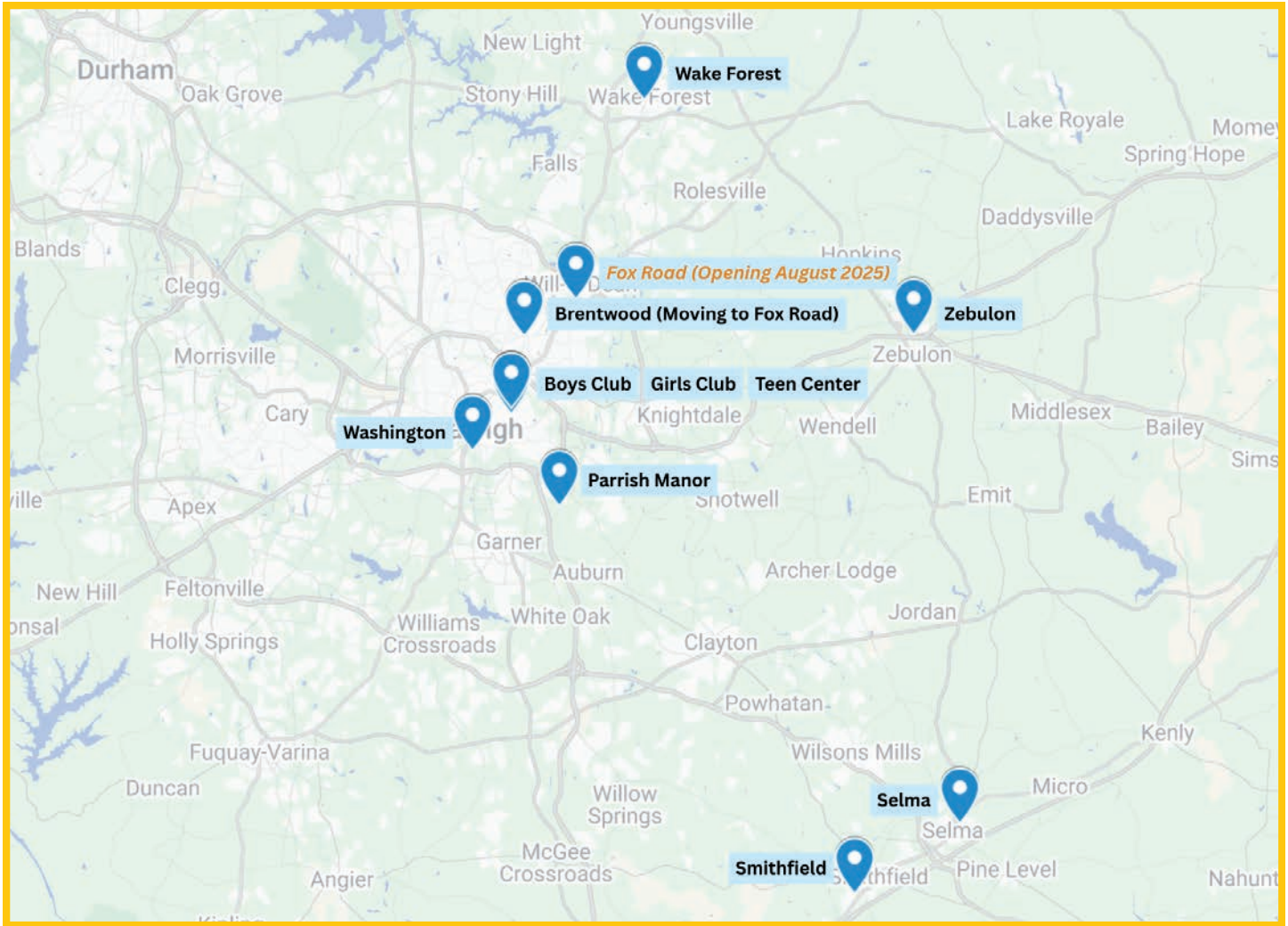
